
Quality of Employment Index (QoE)

Adjusted Multidimensional Headcount (M0) - South America 2015



This map highlights the differences between South American countries in the QoE Index (MO – Adjusted Multidimensional Headcount Ratio). The range of the QoE Index in South America is diverse, going from 0.546 in Bolivia to 0.189 in Chile. The countries with the lowest levels of joint deprivations are Chile, Uruguay, and Brazil. The countries that hold worse levels of deprivation are Paraguay and Bolivia. As a region, South America holds a diverse level of socio-economic and institutional development and these results can help unpack labour market conditions that are instrumentally and intrinsically important for workers (and their dependents). Good jobs can enable citizens to develop their most essential functionings and capabilities.
